VI. District Recognition and Presentations

a. Performance Services Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for Solar Project

Mr. Eric Neff, Director of Personnel thanked the Board of Education for supporting the Solar Project that took place at John G. Carlisle Elementary and Holmes High School. The project is complete. Mr. Ryan Stout, National Solar Manager spoke to the board and provided a video to show the project's completion. The \$7 million project is the largest in the state of Kentucky. The project will improve learning environments and create an approximate \$257,000 energy savings each year. The Board Members along with the Performance Service team had a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the project's completion.

b. Board Member Recognition

January is designated as School Board Member Recognition Month by the National School Boards Association. Mr. Garrison recognized our elected board members who selflessly give their time and energy in support of educating our youth. Covington is fortunate to have some of the most dedicated school board members in the commonwealth of Kentucky. A small reception was held prior to the meeting. 2. Brigance Kindergarten Assessment

Mr. Bill Grein, District Assessment Coordinator, presented the board with Brigance Kindergarten Assessment data. The data shows that students who attended Biggs (State Funded Preschool) improved from 42.7% ready for kindergarten in 2016-17 to 52.6% ready for kindergarten in 2017-18. Covington students who did not attend preschool improved from 2016-17 to 2017-18 by increasing their kindergarten readiness from 24.2% to 30.6% ready. Overall kindergarten readiness for Covington's kindergarten students increased from 40% ready in 2016-17 to 48.1% ready in 2017-18.

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act Grant is a federal competitive grant that runs on a three year cycle. The McKinney-Vento grant's RFA proposal is due by February 2, 2018. Although we did not receive it this last grant cycle due to sustainability and the focus being on start-up programs, we would like permission to apply for the grant again this cycle. Last year CIPS identified 675 students or 16.9% of our District's population. This program addresses needs identified through a comprehensive needs assessment and is education focused. The average award for this grant is approximately \$65,000, districts may or may not receive the total amount requested.
